SCIENTIST JOINS STAFF OF

New York -- David Stone, Ph.D., a long-time investigator in the fields of cancer, biochemistry and behavioral genetics, has joined The Council for Tobacco Research-U.S.A., Inc. as an Associate Research Director.

Dr. Stone comes to The Council from the Worcester (Mass.) Foundation for Experimental Biology where he held the position of Senior Scientist. He joined the foundation in 1952. He also has been Director of Biological Research at Worcester State Hospital since 1961.

A native of England, Dr. Stone received his undergraduate degree at Manchester University. He obtained his doctorate in biochemistry at Yale University in 1951 upon completion of a National Cancer Fellowship.

Dr. Stone has served as a consultant and scientific advisor to the National Institute of Child Health and Human Development, Springfield (Mass.) Hospital Medical Center, Memorial Hospital Research Foundation, Worcester, Mason Research Institute, Worcester, Wrentham (Mass.) State School, and Zacarian Cancer Research Foundation, Springfield.

Author of more than 50 articles in scientific journals and books, he is a member of the American Society for Biological Chemists, American Physiological Society, American Tissue Culture Association, Society for Development Biology, American Genetic Association, New York Academy of Sciences, American Association for the Advancement of Science, and Royal Society of Medicine (Great Britain).
