R. McCuen's crew, and nutured during the summer by Mrs. K. Sanders. The fertilizer used was 800 lb/acre of 6-12-18 for preplanting application. Top dressing was done on June 16, at the rate of 300 lb/acre of 8-0-24.

The leaves from the 20 plants which survived the summer were harvested by G. Nixon and myself in 4 primings, and cured at R&D with a conventional flue curing profile. The dates of harvest, weights and nicotine contents

are listed in the following table.
