

Statement by PM International

Philip Morris and the five other major American cigarette manufacturers annually provide to the United States Department of Health and Human Services a list of ingredients added to tobacco in the manufacturing of cigarettes so that the DHHS can comment on any of those ingredients which may have possible adverse health implications. To date, the DHHS has not raised objections to any of those ingredients. Philip Morris limits its cigarette ingredients to those disclosed to the DHHS for its brands sold in the United States and also for those brands when they are manufactured by itself, its subsidiaries and its licensees for sale around the world.

All of Philip Morris' cigarettes comply with the regulatory requirements of the countries in which they are manufactured and sold.

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
